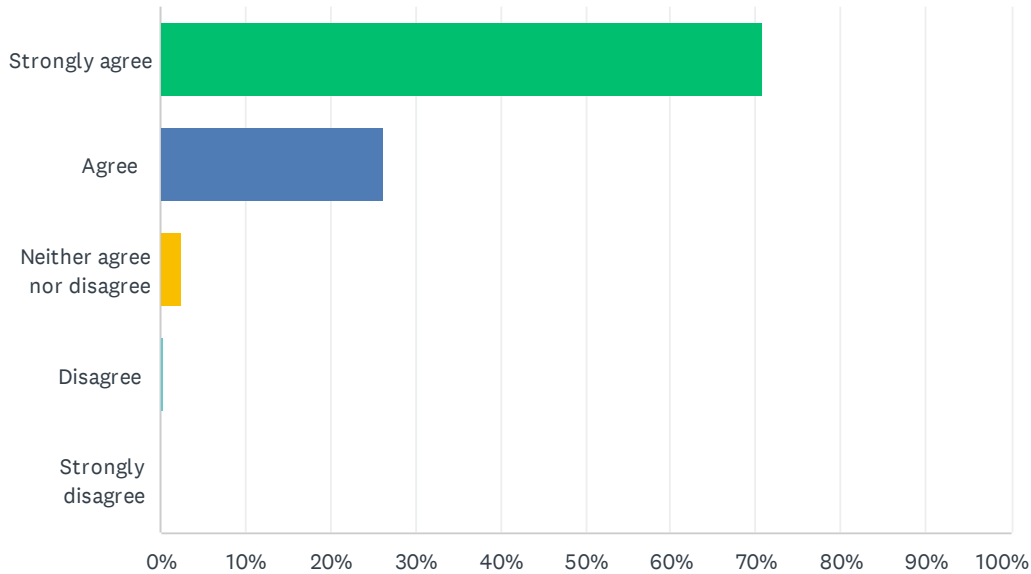


**Q1 16. A new Code for Football Club Governance based on the Sports Governance Code should be introduced for licenced clubs, with compliance being a licensing condition.**

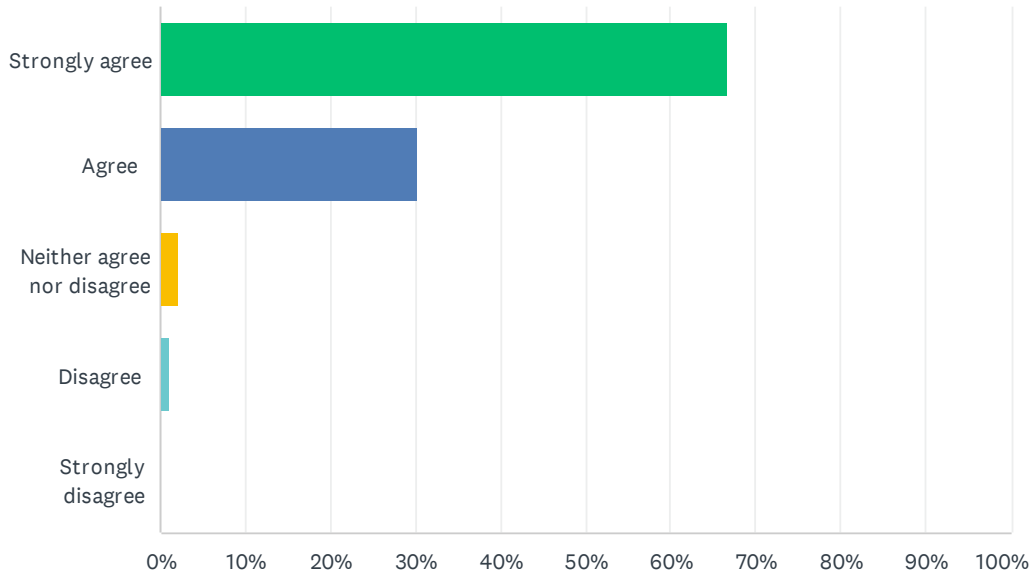

**Q2 17. As a condition of the licence, clubs should be required to publicly present evidence of compliance with the Code for Football Governance on an annual basis.**

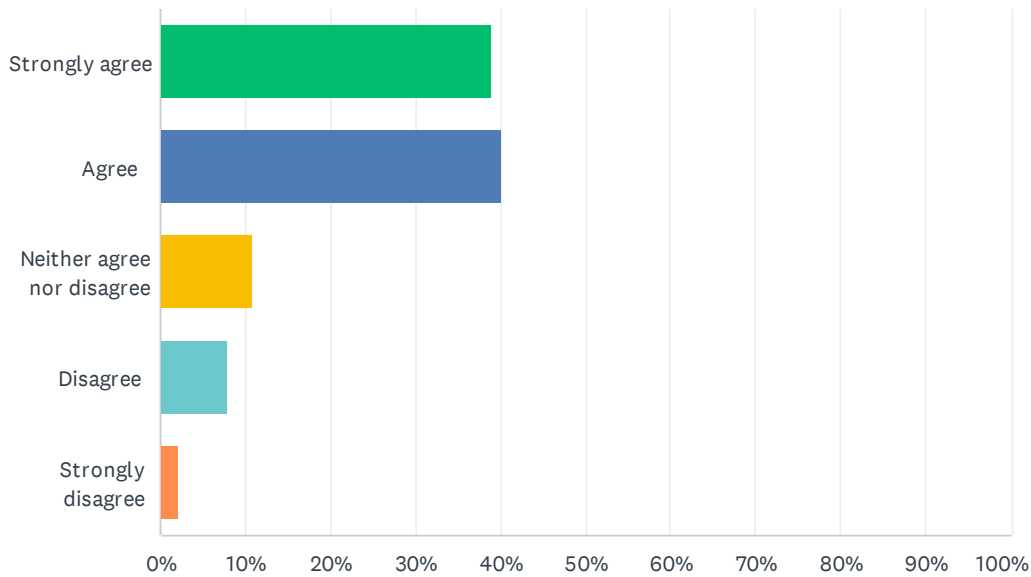

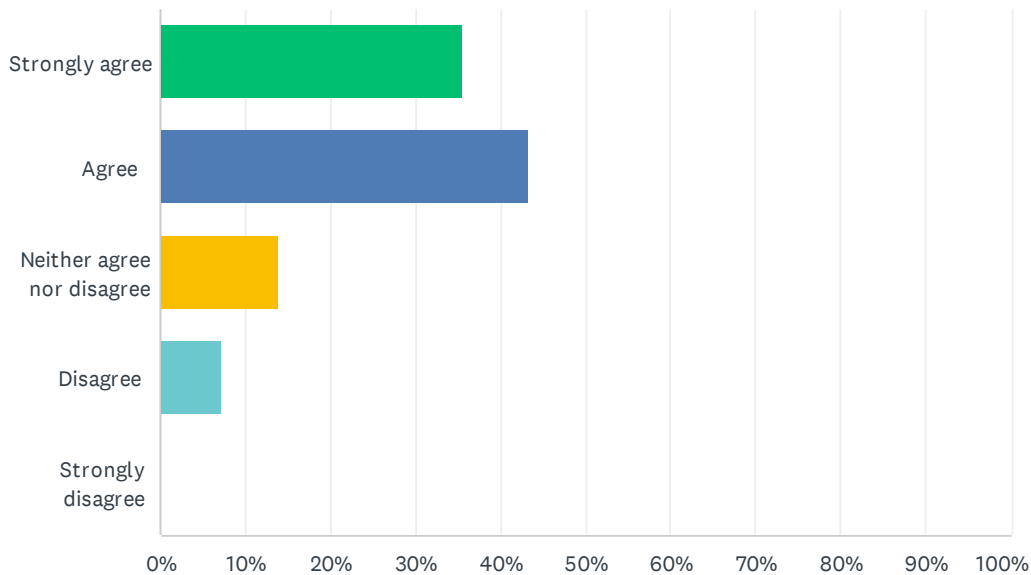

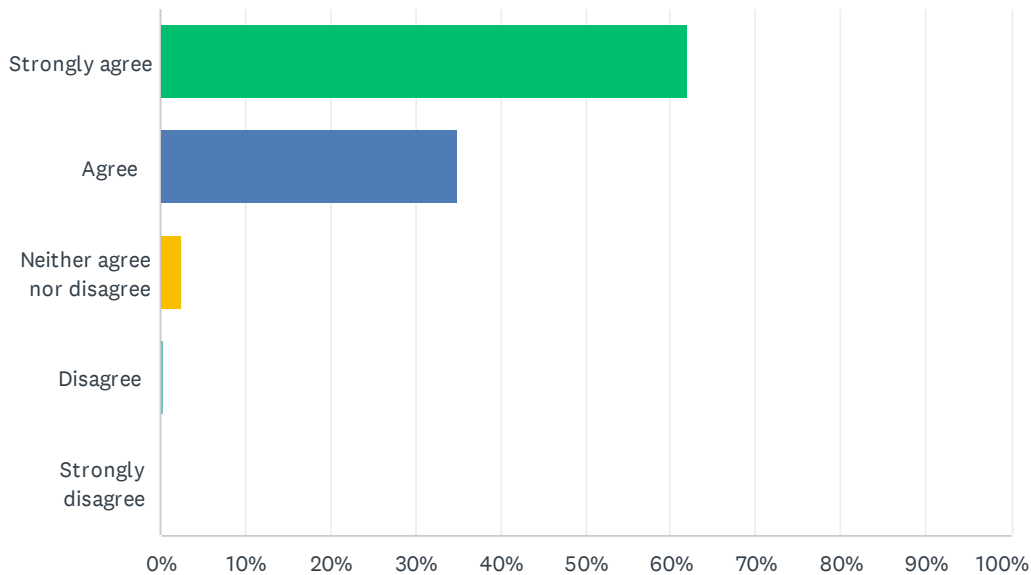

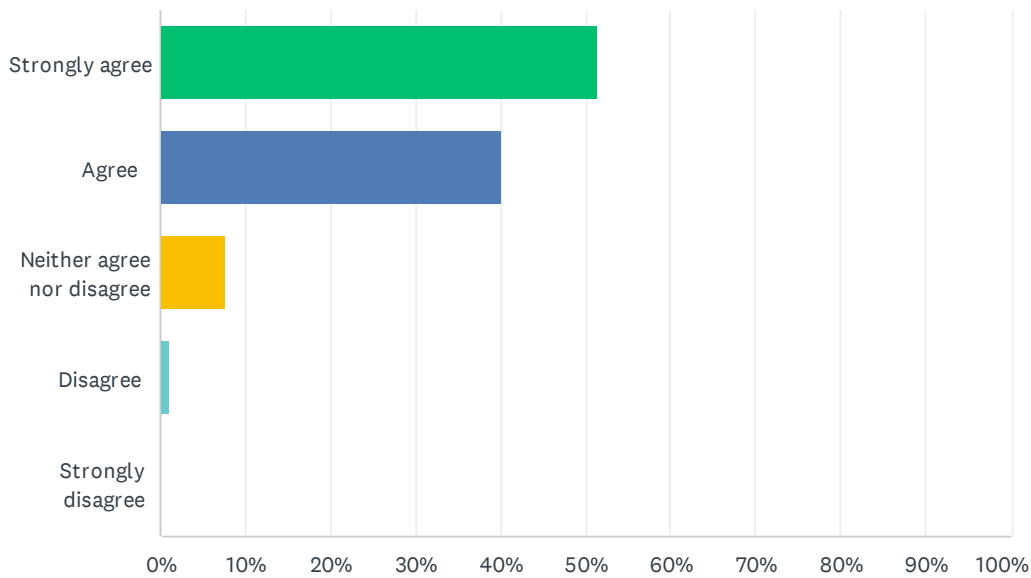

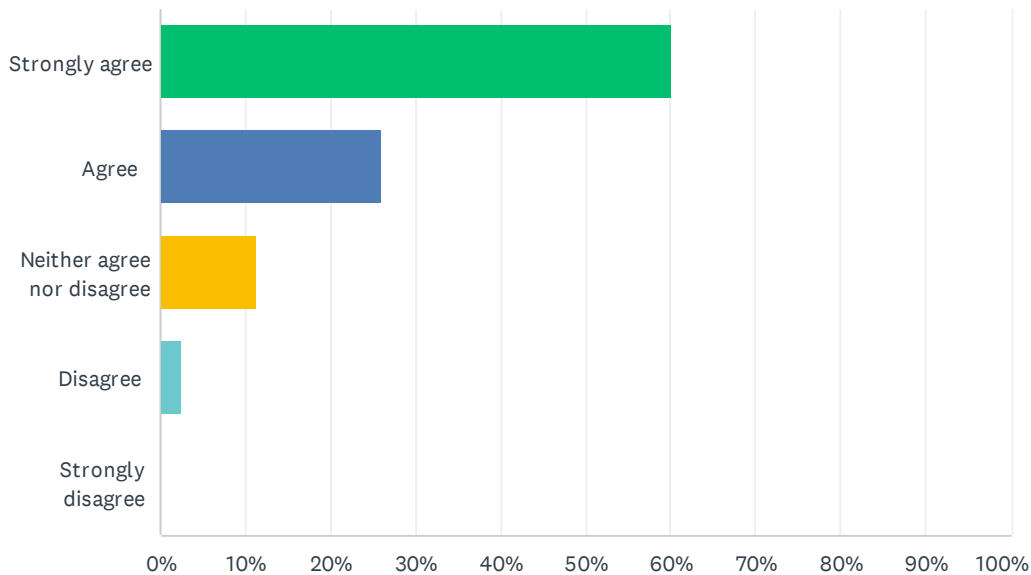
